- Sunisa Lee (Hmong American, b. 2003) An Olympic gold medalist in gymnastics who has leveraged her success into business ventures with companies like CLIF Bar, Amazon, and Gatorade, inspiring a new generation of Hmong entrepreneurs and athletes. Learn more.
- Vera Wang (Chinese American, b. 1949) A renowned fashion designer who started as a figure skater and later built a global luxury brand, demonstrating strong business and management skills in the fashion industry. <u>Learn more.</u>
