#### 8 a. Chairperson's Report

Discussion Chairperson Foley shared the following report:

 Dr. Martin was honored as one of the 2024 Professional Dimensions Imprint Award winners at the April 18 celebration at the Pfister Hotel. Professional Dimensions' Imprint award, formerly known as the Sacagawea Award, was originally established in

1982 to honor career women for their accomplishments as business leaders and trailblazers within the Milwaukee region.

## 8 b. President's Report

#### Discussion

Dr. Martin shared the following:

- On March 28, Restaurant Owner Paul Bartolotta and "Top Chef" Contestant Dan Jacobs visited MATC and shared their insight, inspiration, and experiences with our graduating culinary students in a special session and then another more public meeting with almost 200 MATC students, faculty, staff and visitors.
- Participated in the American Association of Community Colleges conference from April 5 - 8 alongside Steve Herro, the associate dean and project manager of the MATC Drive program, and Dr. Reggie Parks, the retention coach for the MATC Drive program. The presentation highlighted the achievements of MATC's transportation programs and provided insights on how colleges nationwide could adopt and implement similar initiatives in their communities.
- Announced that MATC was recently honored by Cognia for 100 years of excellence as an adult high school. Cognia is a nonprofit organization that provides quality assurance for schools, school districts, and education service providers. MATC is the only one of the 16 Wisconsin Technical College system colleges that operates an adult high school.
- On April 22, MATC welcomed nearly 200 high school seniors in Cooley Auditorium where they signed their letters of intent to attend MATC. The event was kicked off by MATC's drumline from the Music Occupations program. Representatives from all seven of the college's Academic and Career Pathways were on hand to promote their programs.
- Campuses participated in Earth Day activities on April 22 to beautify their neighborhoods. Dr. Martin and her cabinet attended the Earth Day cleanup at Walker's Square and surrounding community, where they were joined by special guests Milwaukee Mayor Cavalier

Johnson, Alderman Jose Perez, and Milwaukee Police Department Chief Jeffrey Norman. The cleanup event was an idea that an ESL student suggested to Dr. Martin at one of her listening sessions.

### 8 c. Legislative Matters Report

#### Discussion

Ms. Laura Bray, vice president, College Advancement, shared highlights of the legislative report from Hubbard Wilson & Zelenkova.

- Nomination papers for candidates for the assembly and the senate are due in June. The next legislative session will be impacted by open seats due to retirements and paired incumbents under the new legislative districts.
- A legislative study committee on the future of the University of Wisconsin system is under consideration for the 2024 legislative interim. If formed, membership would consist of both legislators and members of the public.

## 8 d. Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Report

#### Discussion

Mr. Michael Rogers, interim vice president, Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion, shared highlights from the DEI report.

- Exploring opportunities to dig deeper and align programming with strategic initiatives, specifically more focused on serving students to assist in completion and persistence rates.
- Leading training with MATC Management Essentials group on culturally relevant supervision.
- Developing standard operating procedures with the goal of promoting consistency, efficiency, and accountability.
- Strengthening student services by having more transformational conversations with students with the overall goal of closing equity gaps.
- Reinforcing MATC's partnership with the Mexican Consulate, which will provide opportunities to advance educational opportunities at MATC for Mexican and Latino communities.

#### 8 e. Enrollment Report

#### Discussion

Dr. Phillip King, executive vice president, student success, and Dr. Yan Wang, acting vice president, Enrollment and Retention, presented the enrollment report:

• The college is at 100.09% of its enrollment goal as of April 15, 2024.

## 8 f. Milwaukee PBS General Manager's Report

#### Discussion

Ms. Debbie Hamlett, vice president and general manager of Milwaukee PBS, shared the following:

- End of March revenue is \$5,912,959 towards the \$6.7 Million-dollar goal.
- Visit Milwaukee has tentatively agreed to be one of two underwriters for the Violent Femmes/Milwaukee Symphony program, which will air nationally this fall.
- Students will be working in staff positions on Channel 36 during portions of the day on May 4. Student workshop projects will be shown along with live segments.
- Milwaukee PBS staff were nominated for awards from The Wisconsin Broadcaster Association and The Milwaukee Press Club for stories that were broadcast on Adelante, 10ThirtySix, Black Nouveau, Rhythm Café, and the documentary "A Hallowed Home for Heroes."
- The PBS Annual Meeting will be held the week of May 13.
- PBS will be adding ASL to several children's shows for the first time this fall.

## 8 g. District Student Senate Report

## Discussion

Ms. Kimberly Haynes, student representative reported the following:

- The District Student Government Association held its last meeting of the year on April 19, 2024.
  - Changes to constitution were passed by the students.
  - Approved funding for the Labor Ladies to hold a car show in June and Latinx to hold their year-end celebration.
- Wisconsin Student Government met on February 12, 2024 at Stevens Point and elections were held for next year's board.
- The West Allis Student Life and Student Government are cosponsoring the end of year lunch at the campus on April 29 with a live band and lunch catered by MATC.

## 9 b. Review of FY25 Preliminary Operation Budget

#### Discussion

Ms. Eva Kuether, acting vice president, Finance, shared the FY25 preliminary operation budget.

- The board members requested more detailed information to enhance their understanding of the budget.
- Director Baker proposed creating a budget task force for the 2024-2025 year.

## 9 c. Review of FY25 Year-End Preliminary Capital Remodeling and Renovation Budget (Statutory)

#### Discussion

Mr. Kris Johnson, director, Facilities Planning, answered questions about the FY25 year-end preliminary capital remodeling and renovation budget. Each year the college brings to the board, as a preliminary matter, the projects that have been prioritized and put forward for the next fiscal year in the Capital Remodeling and Renovation Budget.

## 9 d. Westown Green Update

### Discussion

Dr. Phillip King, executive vice president, student success, and Mr. Equan Burrows, dean, Student Experience, highlighted key points from the video presentation.

- In response to recent feedback, senior leaders of the college undertook the following measures:
  - Met additionally with each student that may have had concerns
  - Conducted a walkthrough of the facilities at Westown Green
  - Met individually with Founders 3 property manager, Justin Johnson
  - Created a survey for the students in housing on April 17, 2024
- Student survey responses indicated that the overall rating of the experience at Westown Green was 4.35 of 5, with an overall response rate of 46%.
- The college meets every other week with onsite management to engage all stakeholders in supporting students, resolving complaints, engaging in payment conversations, and ensuring that changing conditions are being managed.
- MATC will be adding more information sessions for students regarding financial aid and payment obligations.
- MATC and Westown Green management will regularly review and improve performance through annual surveys.
- Members of the MATC Student Resource team have provided continuous support to students at Westown Green.

Board members asked that all Westown Green residents be surveyed.

#### ITEM 10. NEW BUSINESS

Board members asked that a Community Education update be given at the next meeting.

Director Mendieta-Ramos requested more information on the initiatives the college is undertaking for HSI.

Chair Foley asked for input from the board before the next meeting about the need to provide an upgrade to the board's accreditation training.

Chair Foley asked board members for feedback on the current committee as a whole structure and if subcommittees or ad hoc committees would be a more appropriate format for specific issues.
